Departmental Climate Action Committee Toolkit

Committee Members:

- Chair
- 1-2 Faculty members
- Staff
- Worklearn/RAs
- Grad Student(s)
- Student volunteers

How to get started:

- 1. Find a faculty member to chair the committee
- 2. Recruit other faculty members, staff, and students
- 3. Put together a roundtable discussion with the department to generate ideas for climate action goals
 - a. These can be large scale (reduce building emissions)
 - b. Or small scale (sustainability promotional posters)
- 4. Develop a departmental Climate Action Plan that addresses the most popular goals
 - a. Promote somewhere, such as a new page on your website
- 5. Encourage committee members to take on action items, and support student volunteers in pursuing passion projects
- 6. Meet 1-2x per term to check in on progress, but check in with individual people/projects more often to support
- 7. Update and monitor the plan as you achieve action items and as your committee grows

Time Commitment (Chair)

- Schedule 1-2 meetings per term
- Guide sub-groups with their projects
- Attend interdepartmental climate committee meetings (1-2x per term)
- Can be as much work as you have the bandwidth to take on start with smaller goals and increase in scale as the committee grows

Funding Resources:

- USI Climate Education Grant
